## **NS Bersales designates PSA XI Officials**



he National Statistician, Dr. Lisa Grace S. Bersales, has designated eight officials to head the regional and provincial offices of Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) in Davao Region.

Taking the lead is Ruben D. Abaro, Jr., designated as OIC-Regional Director. Prior to his designation, OIC-RD Abaro was the former Provincial Statistics Officer (PSO) of PSA-South Cotabato. The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), through the Placement Committee (NPC). completed the placement of its officials and staff. As of March 2016, a total of 1,944 positions were filled in implementing the Department of Budget and Management approved Organizational Structure and Staffing Pattern of PSA pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625. Thirty-two of the total filled-up positions were presidential appointees, while the rest were appointed by the NS. The individual appointments of those holding first level and second level positions were already submitted to Civil Service Commission (CSC), and the NPC is currently waiting for the CSC actions.

# **RSC XI conducts organizational meeting**

The Regional Statistics Committee (RSC) in Davao Region was formally organized during its March 22, 2016 meeting held at the Conference Hall of NEDA-RDC XI, Davao City.

The organizational meeting was attended by 22 out of the 26 de facto and appointed member agencies, Local Government Units (LGUs), academe and private organization. Director Maria Lourdes D. Lim, Chairperson of RSC XI and Regional Director of National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) XI, presided the meeting. With her were the committee Vice-Chairperson, Director Ruben D. Abaro, Jr., and committee Secretary, Mr. Rosendo M. Aya-ay. In her opening message, Director Lim stressed the vital role of the RSC in Davao Region's statistical development activities and urged all RSC partners to provide technical expertise.



During this meeting, RSC XI passed and approved five resolutions: (1) Constituting the Membership of the Regional Statistics Committee in Davao Region; (2) Adopting the RSC XI Agenda Forecast for CY 2016; (3) Adopting the Results of Training Needs Assessment for Priority Statistical Trainings in Davao Region; (4) Requesting the Regional Development Council XI to Endorse the Conduct of the Barangay Agricultural Profiling Survey (BAPS) in Davao Region; and (5) Enjoining the RLAs, LGUs, Academe and the Private Sector to Participate in the 13th National Convention on Statistics.

The creation of RSC XI was in pursuant to Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Board Resolution No. 05, series of 2015, "Establishing the Regional Statistics Committees (RSCs)." The committee serves as the policymaking body on statistical matters and a venue for discussion and resolution of statistical issues in the region.



# PSA XI launches project for senior citizens

A s part of the celebration of Civil Registration Month (CRM) every February, PSA XI launched a project called "Get Every Senior Citizen of Region 11 in the Picture". This was in partnership with the local civil registrars in the region. The project aimed at ensuring one of the basic sectors in our society who were not yet registered in the local civil registrars to be registered.

A designated help desk catered by a Public Assistance and Complaint Desk (PACD) officer was created to accommodate senior citizen clients. The project, though, was intended to serve senior citizens born in Davao Region and only implemented for the month of February.

The project was also in consonance with Presidential Proclamation No. 1106 signed on August 20, 2015 declaring 2015-2024 as Civil Registration and Vital Statistics (CRVS) Decade.



# PSA XI joins the sixth cluster AgStat orientation/ training

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) XI participated in Cluster VI Agricultural Statistics (AgStat) Orientation/Training at Microtel Inn and Suites in General Santos City on March 14-18, 2016. Four regional and 15 provincial staff from Davao Region joined the activity.



The training for the sixth cluster which composed of Regions XI, XII, and Caraga was spearheaded by the Economic Sector Statistics Service (ESSS) and Macroeconomic Accounts Service (MAS) of the Sectoral Statistics Office (SSO). The PSA XII hosted the said five-day event. Similar with other training clusters, the officers and staff from ESSS and MAS of PSA Central Office acted as trainers and speakers.

The activity primarily aimed to orient those participants who have not been immersed into any AgStat activities and to refresh some AgStat focal persons on the agricultural data systems. The discussion included the data systems for crops, livestock and poultry, fisheries, and farm prices as well as the guidelines on Damage Assessment and Reporting System (DARS). Highlighted topics were the concepts, survey methodology, survey operations, data processing, and data review for each data system. Presentation on the Performance of Agriculture and on the various dissemination methods concluded the event.

#### SOCD conducts staff orientation on statistical activities

In an effort to integrate and immerse the staff of the various statistical activities being undertaken by the former agencies prior to implementation of Republic Act 10625, the Statistical Operations and Coordination Division (SOCD) of PSA XI initiated the conduct of staff orientation held last January 21, 2016 at PSA XI Conference Room, Cabaquio Avenue, Davao City.

succeeded in levelling the understanding on the various programs and projects of the former Bureau of Agricultural Statistics (BAS), National Statistical Coordination Board (NSCB), and National Statistics Office (NSO).

Ms. Ma. Josephine F. Andales, Ms. Marina P. Araneta and Ms. Corazon P. Dres led the presentation on the works of the former BAS, NSCB, and NSO, respectively.

After the orientation, OIC-RD Abaro encouraged the staff to strive towards achieving unified statistical work endeavors.

PHILIPPINE STATISTICAL ACT OF 2013 (Republic Act No. 10625)

On 12 September 2013, President Benigno Aquino III signed Republic Act No. 10625, otherwise known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013, mandating the establishment of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) and the reorganization of the Philippine Statistical System (PSS), paving the way for the merging of four major statistical agencies (Bureau of Agricultural Statistics, Bureau of Labor and Employment Statistics, National Statistical Coordination Board, and National Statistics Office) engaged in primary data collection and compilation of secondary data.
