Improved Civil Registration Services through DeCAP



The Decentralized Copy Annotation
Process (DeCAP) training was
conducted by Regional Statistical
Services Office - Davao Region last
16 and 17 December 2019 at Seda

Hotel, J.P. Laurel Ave, Davao City.

DeCAP is a system that enables the Regional Serbilis Outlets to cater requests for copy issuance of annotated civil registry documents. Further, the system will reduce the processing time and ultimately bring civil registration services closer to the people.

DeCap aims to improve the feedback and coordination mechanism with clients and the Local Civil
Registrars to address the increasing
volume of transactions and reducing
processing time thereby complying
with Ease of Doing Business and
Efficient Government Service Act of
2018 (RA 11032).

The activity was attended by selected Local Civil Registrars of all Provinces and Registration Officers of Provincial Statistical Offices of Davao Region as well as Regional Office representatives.

Field Visit to Manufacturing Establishments



A Field Visit to Selected

Manufacturing Establishments
for the Updating of Supply Utilization
Accounts/Food Balance Sheet was
conducted by the PSA RSSO XI in

Coordination with Agricultural Accounts Division (AAD) of the Macroeconomics Accounts Services (MAS) of PSA Central Office.

The Food Balance Sheet (FBS) presents a comprehensive picture of the pattern of the country's food supply during a specified reference period, while the Supply Utilization Accounts (SUA) is a comprehensive

statistical framework for the physical accounting commodities produced in the country.

The activity aimed to gather data for the updating of SUA/FBS parameters of mango, banana, cacao, and fish manufacturing establishment.



PSA XI Disseminates NDPS Results

The 2016 National Disability
Prevalence Survey or the Model
Functioning Survey (NDPS/MFS)
results show that around 12 percent
of Filipinos age 15 and older
experienced severe disability and

almost one in every two (47%) experienced moderate disability while 23 percent with mild disability. Nearly one-fifth (19%) experienced nodisability. The disability prevalence rate also corresponds to the percentage of persons with severe disability presented by Assistant National Statistician

(ANS) Wilma A. Guillen of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) during the Data Dissemination Forum Conducted by PSA RSSO-Davao Region on 10 December 2019 at Pinnacle Hotel and Suites, Sta. Ana Avenue, Davao City. ANS Guillen also

presented that females more likely than males to experience severe and moderate disabilities with a percentage of 15% and 9%, respectively. Furthermore, almost one in every three persons (32%) with

severe disability belonged to the older population age group of 60 and older.

The NDPS/MFS 2016 is a general population survey that allows for a direct comparison of the needs and barriers faced by groups with differing levels of disability, including people

without disability/disabilities. NDPS/ MFS 2016 seeks to provide detailed and nuanced information about how people conduct their lives and the difficulties they encounter regardless of any underlying health condition or

impairment.

Likewise, NDPS/MFS 2016 was carried out in the Philippines to provide information among policymakers and program managers for evidence-based decisions in formulating policies

and in designing programs.

Earthquake Preparedness Drill Training



The PSA RSSO-Davao Region along with five of the officials and employees of the PSA Davao del Sur, with the guidance of Training Instructors from the Davao City Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office, conducted an Earthquake Drill on 25 November 2019.

Mr. Charlie B. Agustin, discussed some facts on why the country experiences natural disasters. He also explained Republic Act 10121 or The Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010. The discussion then proceeded to Disaster Action Preparedness by Mr. Ireneo B. Nipa,

Jr. The 2 Training Instructors then simultaneously explained and showed what to do during, before and after an earthquake. They displayed the proper position of protecting oneself during an earthquake and how to properly evacuate a building.

In the afternoon, the earthquake drill was conducted. The trainers from the CDDMO evaluated the performance of the PSA officials and employees. Accordingly, the employees and officials can hasten their pace in evacuating but still be careful with their movements.
