Highlights of Population in the Municipality of Maco based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH)

Municipality of Maco population was recorded at 83,237 persons

The total population of the Municipality of Maco as of May 1, 2020 was 83,237 persons based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH). It accounted for about 10.8 percent of the Davao de Oro population in 2020.

The population of the municipality for the year 2020 is higher by 1,960 persons compared with the population of 81,277 in 2015; by 11,002 persons compared with the population of 72,235 in 2010; and by 18,056 persons compared with the population of 65,181 in 2000. (see *Table 1*)

The municipality population grew by 0.50 percent

The total population of Maco increased by 0.50 percent annually, on average, during the period of 2015 to 2020. By comparison, the rate at which the municipality population grew during the period of 2010 to 2015 was higher at 2.27 percent (see *Table 2*)

Barangay Poblacion consistently has the biggest population municipalwide

The Municipality of Maco has 37 barangays. In 2020, Barangay Poblacion had the biggest population with 8,521 persons residing in the barangay or contributed 10.24 percent out of the total population of the municipality, followed by Barangay Binuangan with 6,764 persons or 8.13 percent and Barangay Elizalde (Somil) with 5,204 persons or 6.25 percent, respectively. (see Table 3)

Barangay New Barili had the smallest population size with 570 persons or accounted for only 0.68 percent of the municipality population, followed by Barangay Manipongol with 578 persons or 0.69 percent and Barangay Sangab with 583 persons or 0.70 percent.

Lumatab is the fastest growing barangay

Barangay Lumatab was the fastest growing barangay in the municipality with an average annual population growth rate (PGR) of 5.97 percent during the period of 2015 to 2020. It was followed by Barangay Anibongan with a PGR of 4.85 percent, and Barangay Limbo with 3.99 percent. (see Table 4)

On the other hand, Barangay Elizalde (Somil) was the slowest growing barangay with a PGR of 0.27 percent, followed by Barangay Langgam with PGR of 0.31 percent, and Barangay Poblacion with PGR of 0.73 percent. (see Table 5)

Additionally, there were 16 barangays that posted a negative PGR. (see Table 6)

TECHNICAL NOTES

- The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority in September 2020 pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 and B.P. Blg. 72 further accorded the PSA the authority to conduct population censuses every ten (10) years beginning in 1980.
- Information on the count of the population were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2020 as the census reference time and date.
- The 2020 CPH is the country's 15th Census of Population and 7th Census of Housing since 1903.
- Doubling **time** is the amount of time it takes for a given quantity to double in size or value at a constant growth rate. We can find the doubling time for a population undergoing exponential growth by using the **Rule of 70**. To compute for doubling time, we divide 70 by the growth rate (r).
- His Excellency President Rodrigo R. Duterte declared as official for all purposes the population counts by province, city/municipality, and barangay, based on the 2020 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were based on census questionnaires accomplished by about 90,000 enumerators deployed during the nationwide census taking.
- The successful completion of the census-taking was made possible with the support of the local and national officials, government agencies, local government units, media, private agencies, and non-government organizations.
