Highlights of Population in the Municipality of Maragusan based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH)

Municipality of Maragusan population was recorded at 64,412 persons

The total population of the Municipality of Maragusan as of May 1, 2020 was 64,412 persons based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH). It accounted for about 8.4 percent of the Davao de Oro population in 2020.

The population of the municipality for the year 2020 is higher by 3,570 persons compared with the population of 60,842 in 2015; by 8,909 persons compared with the population of 55,503 in 2010; and by 18,475 persons compared with the population of 45,937 in 2000. (see Table 1)

The municipality population grew by 1.21 percent

The total population of Maragusan increased by 1.21 percent annually, on average, during the period of 2015 to 2020. By comparison, the rate at which the municipality population grew during the period of 2010 to 2015 was higher at 1.76 percent (see Table 2)

Barangay Maragusan (Poblacion) consistently has the biggest population municipalwide

The Municipality of Maragusan has 24 barangays. In 2020, Barangay Maragusan (Poblacion) had the biggest population with 15,488 persons residing in the barangay or contributed 24.04 percent out of the total population of the municipality, followed by Barangay Mapawa with 5,932 persons or 9.21 percent and Barangay New Albay with 4,185 persons or 6.50 percent, respectively. (see Table 3)

Barangay Mabugnao had the smallest population size with 406 persons or accounted for only 0.63 percent of the municipality population, followed by Barangay Mahayahay with 663 persons or 1.03 percent and Barangay Tandik with 754 persons or 1.17 percent.

Langgawisan is the fastest growing barangay

Barangay Langgawisan was the fastest growing barangay in the municipality with an average annual population growth rate (PGR) of 8.73 percent during the period of 2015 to 2020. It was followed by Barangay Magcagong with a PGR of 8.21 percent, and Barangay Bahi with 5.43 percent. (see Table 4)

On the other hand, Barangay New Panay was the slowest growing barangay with a PGR of 0.14 percent, followed by Barangay Mauswagon and Coronobe with PGR of 0.45 percent, and Barangay New Man-ay with PGR of 0.59 percent. The population count of Barangay Tigbao from year 2015 to 2020 remain the same and thereby, no population growth.

Additionally, there were Eight (8) barangays that posted a negative PGR. Barangay Katipunan posted the highest negative APGR of 3.56 percent, while Barangay Paloc posted the lowest negative APGR of 0.01 percent. (see Table 5)

TECHNICAL NOTES





- The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority in September 2020 pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 and B.P. Blg. 72 further accorded the PSA the authority to conduct population censuses every ten (10) years beginning in 1980.
- Information on the count of the population were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2020 as the census reference time and date.
- The 2020 CPH is the country's 15th Census of Population and 7th Census of Housing since 1903.
- Doubling time is the amount of time it takes for a given quantity to double in size or
 value at a constant growth rate. We can find the doubling time for a population
 undergoing exponential growth by using the Rule of 70. To compute for doubling time,
 we divide 70 by the growth rate (r).
- His Excellency President Rodrigo R. Duterte declared as official for all purposes the
 population counts by province, city/municipality, and barangay, based on the 2020
 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were
 based on census questionnaires accomplished by about 90,000 enumerators deployed
 during the nationwide census taking.
- The successful completion of the census-taking was made possible with the support of the local and national officials, government agencies, local government units, media, private agencies, and non-government organizations.
