Highlights of Population in the Municipality of Mawab based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH)

Municipality of Mawab population was recorded at 39,631 persons

The total population of the Municipality of Mawab as of May 1, 2020 was 39,631 persons based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH). It accounted for about 5.2 percent of the Davao de Oro population in 2020.

The population of the municipality for the year 2020 is higher by 2,566 persons compared with the population of 37,065 in 2015; by 3,933 persons compared with the population of 35,698 in 2010; and by 7,628 persons compared with the population of 32,003 in 2000. (see Table 1)

The municipality population grew by 1.42 percent

The total population of Mawab increased by 1.42 percent annually, on average, during the period of 2015 to 2020. By comparison, the rate at which the municipality population grew during the period of 2010 to 2015 was lower at 0.72 percent (see Table 2)

Barangay Poblacion consistently has the biggest population municipalwide

The Municipality of Mawab has 11 barangays. In 2020, Barangay Poblacion had the biggest population with 11,423 persons residing in the barangay or contributed 28.82 percent out of the total population of the municipality, followed by Barangay Andili with 5,141 persons or 12.97 percent and Barangay Nuevo Iloco with 5,115 persons or 12.91 percent, respectively. Barangay Concepcion had the smallest population size with 983 persons or accounted for only 2.48 percent of the municipality population, followed by Barangay Saosao with 1,738 persons or 4.38 percent and Barangay Bawani with 2,062 persons or 5.20 percent.

Tuboran is the fastest growing barangay

Barangay Tuboran was the fastest growing barangay in the municipality with an average annual population growth rate (PGR) of 3.42 percent during the period of 2015 to 2020. It was followed by Barangay Saosao with a PGR of 2.87 percent, and Barangay Nuevo Iloco with 2.53 percent. (see Table 4)

On the other hand, Barangay Malinawon was the slowest growing barangay with a PGR of 0.10 percent, followed by Barangay Sawangan with PGR of 1.04 percent, and Barangay Andili with PGR of 1.08 percent.

Additionally, Barangay Concepcion and Salvacion posted a negative PGR of 2.69 percent and 1.40 percent, respectively.



TECHNICAL NOTES

- The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority in September 2020 pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 and B.P. Blg. 72 further accorded the PSA the authority to conduct population censuses every ten (10) years beginning in 1980.
- Information on the count of the population were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2020 as the census reference time and date.
- The 2020 CPH is the country's 15th Census of Population and 7th Census of Housing since 1903.
- Doubling **time** is the amount of time it takes for a given quantity to double in size or value at a constant growth rate. We can find the doubling time for a population undergoing exponential growth by using the **Rule of 70**. To compute for doubling time, we divide 70 by the growth rate (r).
- His Excellency President Rodrigo R. Duterte declared as official for all purposes the
 population counts by province, city/municipality, and barangay, based on the 2020
 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were
 based on census questionnaires accomplished by about 90,000 enumerators deployed
 during the nationwide census taking.
- The successful completion of the census-taking was made possible with the support of the local and national officials, government agencies, local government units, media, private agencies, and non-government organizations.
