Highlights of Population in the Municipality of Nabunturan based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH)

Municipality of Nabunturan population was recorded at 84,340 persons

The total population of the Municipality of Nabunturan as of May 1, 2020 was 84,340 persons based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH). It accounted for about 11.0 percent of the Davao de Oro population in 2020.

The population of the municipality for the year 2020 is higher by 2,106 persons compared with the population of 82,234 in 2015; by 11,144 persons compared with the population of 73,196 in 2010; and by 23,797 persons compared with the population of 60,543 in 2000. (see *Table 1*)

The municipality population grew by 0.53 percent

The total population of Nabunturan increased by 0.53 percent annually, on average, during the period of 2015 to 2020. By comparison, the rate at which the municipality population grew during the period of 2010 to 2015 was higher at 2.24 percent (see *Table 2*)

Barangay Poblacion consistently has the biggest population municipalwide

The Municipality of Nabunturan has 28 barangays. In 2020, Barangay Poblacion had the biggest population with 16,552 persons residing in the barangay or contributed 19.62 percent out of the total population of the municipality, followed by Barangay Mainit with 8,271 persons or 9.81 percent and Barangay Magsaysay with 6,189 persons or 7.34 percent, respectively. (see Table 3)

Barangay Sasa had the smallest population size with 619 persons or accounted for only 0.73 percent of the municipality population, followed by Barangay New Daus and San Vicente with 633 and 636 persons or 0.75 percent and Barangay Bayabas with 852 persons or 1.01 percent.

Linda is the fastest growing barangay

Barangay Linda was the fastest growing barangay in the municipality with an average annual population growth rate (PGR) of 8.26 percent during the period of 2015 to 2020. It was followed by Barangay Tagnocon with a PGR of 5.46 percent, and Barangay Santa Maria with 4.81 percent. (see Table 4)

On the other hand, Barangay New Daus was the slowest growing barangay with a PGR of 0.40 percent, followed by Barangay Sasa with PGR of 0.76 percent, and Barangay Mipangi with PGR of 0.89 percent.

Additionally, 8 barangays of Nabunturan posted a negative PGR, of which Barangay Ogao has the highest negative PGR of 3.80 percent, while Barangay Bayabas has the lowest negative PGR of 1.24 percent. .

TECHNICAL NOTES

- The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority in September 2020 pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 and B.P. Blg. 72 further accorded the PSA the authority to conduct population censuses every ten (10) years beginning in 1980.
- Information on the count of the population were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2020 as the census reference time and date.
- The 2020 CPH is the country's 15th Census of Population and 7th Census of Housing since 1903.
- Doubling **time** is the amount of time it takes for a given quantity to double in size or value at a constant growth rate. We can find the doubling time for a population undergoing exponential growth by using the **Rule of 70**. To compute for doubling time, we divide 70 by the growth rate (r).
- His Excellency President Rodrigo R. Duterte declared as official for all purposes the population counts by province, city/municipality, and barangay, based on the 2020 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were based on census questionnaires accomplished by about 90,000 enumerators deployed during the nationwide census taking.
- The successful completion of the census-taking was made possible with the support of the local and national officials, government agencies, local government units, media, private agencies, and non-government organizations.
