Highlights of Population in the Municipality of New Bataan based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH)

## Municipality of New Bataan population was recorded at 51,466 persons

The total population of the Municipality of New Bataan as of May 1, 2020 was 51,446 persons based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH). It accounted for about 6.7 percent of the Davao de Oro population in 2020.

The population of the municipality for the year 2020 is higher by 3,740 persons compared with the population of 47,726 in 2015; by 3,996 persons compared with the population of 47,470 in 2010; and by 8,917 persons compared with the population of 42,549 in 2000. (see Table 1)

### The municipality population grew by 1.60 percent

The total population of New Bataan increased by 1.60 percent annually, on average, during the period of 2015 to 2020. By comparison, the rate at which the municipality population grew during the period of 2010 to 2015 was lower at 0.10 percent (see Table 2)

# Barangay Cabinuangan (Poblacion) consistently has the biggest population municipalwide

The Municipality of New Bataan has 16 barangays. In 2020, Barangay Cabinuangan (Poblacion) had the biggest population with 11,018 persons residing in the barangay or contributed 21.41 percent out of the total population of the municipality, followed by Barangay Andap with 6,697 persons or 13.01 percent and Barangay San Roque with 5,949 persons or 11.56 percent, respectively. (see Table 3)

Barangay Pagsabangan had the smallest population size with 506 persons or accounted for only 0.98 percent of the municipality population, followed by Barangay Fatima with 1,181 persons or 2.29 percent and Barangay Cogonon with 1,233 persons or 2.40 percent.

### San Roque is the fastest growing barangay

Barangay San Roque was the fastest growing barangay in the municipality with an average annual population growth rate (PGR) of 13.06 percent during the period of 2015 to 2020. It was followed by Barangay Panag with a PGR of 4.04 percent, and Barangay Tandawan with 3.75 percent. (see Table 4)

On the other hand, Barangay Cogonon was the slowest growing barangay with a PGR of 0.22 percent, followed by Barangay Camanlangan with PGR of 0.85 percent, and Barangay Cabinuangan (Poblacion) with PGR of 0.87 percent.

Additionally, 6 barangays of New Bataan posted a negative PGR, of which Barangay Pagsabangan has the highest negative PGR of 2.87 percent, while Barangay Manurigao has the lowest negative PGR of 0.01 percent.

### **TECHNICAL NOTES**

- The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority in September 2020 pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 and B.P. Blg. 72 further accorded the PSA the authority to conduct population censuses every ten (10) years beginning in 1980.
- Information on the count of the population were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2020 as the census reference time and date.
- The 2020 CPH is the country's 15th Census of Population and 7th Census of Housing since 1903.
- Doubling time is the amount of time it takes for a given quantity to double in size or
  value at a constant growth rate. We can find the doubling time for a population
  undergoing exponential growth by using the Rule of 70. To compute for doubling time,
  we divide 70 by the growth rate (r).
- His Excellency President Rodrigo R. Duterte declared as official for all purposes the
  population counts by province, city/municipality, and barangay, based on the 2020
  CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were
  based on census questionnaires accomplished by about 90,000 enumerators deployed
  during the nationwide census taking.
- The successful completion of the census-taking was made possible with the support of the local and national officials, government agencies, local government units, media, private agencies, and non-government organizations.
