WHEREAS, the PSA XI shall compile and regularly update Davao Region's SDG performance through the Region XI SDG Watch that will monitor 72 Core Regional SDG Indicators;

WHEREAS, PSA XI has produced the maiden issue of the Region XI SDG Watch, which this Committee finds comprehensive and useful for tracking the SDG performance of the Region;
