PSA Davao de Oro Joins Tree Growing and Tree Planting Activities in Celebration of Arbor Day and Environmental Preservation Efforts

In support of local environmental initiatives, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Davao de Oro actively participated in two tree growing and tree planting activities in coordination with the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) of LGU Nabunturan and Montevista.

On June 25, 2025, in celebration of Arbor Day, PSA Davao de Oro employees joined the tree planting activity held at the riverbank area of Barangay Mipangi, Nabunturan. The activity was participated in by regular employees, spearheaded by Senior Statistical Specialist Ronald R. Piad, office-based Contract of Service Workers (COSW), and selected statistical researchers. This initiative highlighted the agency's commitment to environmental sustainability and community partnership.

Meanwhile, on June 27, 2025, PSA Davao de Oro continued its advocacy through another tree planting activity at the Small Water Impounding Project (SWIP) Area in Barangay Linoan, Montevista.

This activity was conducted with the assistance of MENRO Montevista and was joined by office-based COSWs and some statistical researchers.

Both activities aimed to promote environmental awareness, support local greening programs, and contribute to climate change mitigation. Through these efforts, PSA Davao de Oro reaffirms its dedication not only to quality statistical service but also to ecological preservation and community development.

Bringing Identity Closer to the People: National ID Accomplishments in Davao de Oro (First Semester 2025)

For the first half of 2025, PSA Davao de Oro registered 695,910 individuals under the National Identification System, covering 90.7% of the province's 767,547 population based on the 2020 Census. The office also issued 142,233 paper-based National IDs (ePhilIDs), allowing registrants to use their IDs while waiting for the physical card. In addition, 15,540 children below 4 years old were registered, ensuring early access to essential services such as health, education, and social protection.

To further strengthen the program's reach and efficiency, the PSA Davao de Oro team collaborated with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) by participating in Family Development Sessions (FDS) of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps). This collocation allowed for the authentication of National ID records of 4Ps beneficiaries, ensuring accurate verification and enabling smoother facilitation of government assistance.

The team also went beyond the registration centers by participating in multiple caravans organized by local government units. These included 10 "Serbisyo Uban sa Gugma" Caravans by LGU Nabunturan, the "Let's Go Serbisyo Caravan" by LGU Maragusan, and the "Tunol Serbisyo" Caravans in Compostela and Laak. Through these outreach activities, the team was able to register unregistered individuals in remote and underserved communities, proving that access to identity is a right that knows no boundaries.



Further extending its reach, the team conducted house-to-house registrations, especially for senior citizens who are bedridden or physically unable to travel. Special registrations were also carried out in hospitals to accommodate patients who might otherwise miss the opportunity to register due to health conditions. These efforts underscore the team's strong resolve to make the PhilSys program truly inclusive—reaching even those in the margins of society.

All these accomplishments for the first semester of 2025 reflect the tireless commitment of the PSA Davao de Oro PhilSys team to bring the National ID registration service closer to the people. Through strategic partnerships, on-the-ground efforts, and compassion-driven initiatives, the team has successfully demonstrated that national identification is more than a program—it is a service, a right, and a step toward a more connected and empowered Filipino community.

PSC Davao de Oro Approves Two Resolutions in 2nd Regular Meeting

The Provincial Statistics Committee (PSC) of Davao de Oro successfully held its second regular meeting for 2025 on June 23 at the Comval Hotel in Nabunturan. The committee has approved two key resolutions: one encouraging the support of various sectors for the 36th National Statistics Month (NSM) celebration, and another urging agencies and stakeholders to share data necessary for the Provincial Product Accounts (PPA) compilation in the province.

The meeting was presided over by PSC Co-Chairperson and Chief Statistical Specialist Abraham Enrico E. Gulay, Jr. of PSA Davao de Oro. Eleven member agencies and a guest from the Provincial Investment Division participated in the discussions.

Among the highlights of the meeting were updates and presentations on the region's

economic performance for 2024, findings from the 2024 Functional Literacy, Education, and Mass Media Survey (FLEMMS), and the provincial report on the 35th Civil Registration Month (CRM). The committee also tackled updates on several ongoing initiatives including the PSA-LGU Data Sharing and Business Register Project (PLDS-BRP), the PPA compilation, and preparations for the dissemination of the 2024 Census of Population results and the turnover of Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) data, and the advocacy plans for the 36th NSM.

The meeting reaffirmed the PSC's commitment to advancing statistics as a key tool for good governance, policy development, and inclusive growth. The committee is set to reconvene for its next regular meeting in the third quarter of 2025.

Davao de Oro Successfully Conducts 2nd Quarter 2025 Palay and Corn Production Survey

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Davao de Oro Provincial Statistical Office successfully conducted the 2nd Quarter Palay and Corn Production Survey (PCPS) from July 1 to 10.

The survey aims to generate estimates on palay and corn production, area harvested, and yield per hectare which are vital inputs in policy formulation, food security planning, and agricultural development programs.

Prior to the field operations, a two-day training was held on June 24-25, 2025, at the PSA Davao de Oro Training Room. The training equipped Statistical Researchers (SRs) with the necessary knowledge and

tools for accurate and efficient data collection, ensuring adherence to prescribed methodologies and guidelines.

The PCPS is a regular quarterly activity of PSA that plays a crucial role in capturing the situation of palay and corn in the country. Data gathered from the survey contributes significantly to national and regional statistics used by planners, policy-makers, and stakeholders in the agriculture sector.

The PSA Davao de Oro extends its gratitude to all farmer-respondents and stakeholders who participated in the survey and reaffirms its commitment to delivering quality statistics for evidence-based decision-making.
