Chief Statistical Specialist Pepito D. Amoyen highlighted the list of possible assistance to be provided by the CCBs. One of it is use of LGU and government facilities as the venue of the training, headquarters of the data collectors and supervisors, storage area of CBMS equipment and materials, data processing centers, community validation, and other CBMS activities as deemed necessary.



It was discussed also that the person conducting the data collection shall ask the respondents whether they would like to make an explicit waiver to authorize the city and municipality to disclose their identity and other relevant information about their household to the government agency which provides social protection programs for them.
