NATIONAL ID REGISTRATION: PSA DAVAO DEL SUR BRIDGES SITIO PEGALONGAN, AIDING THE MATIG-SALUG TRIBE



On February 19-21, 2025, the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) Davao del Sur Provincial Statistical Office conducted a National ID Registration in Sitio Pegalongan, Marilog District, Davao City. In partnership with the City Civil Registration Office (CCRO) and Indigenous People Civil Registration System (IPCRS), the initiative focused on registering members of the Matig-Salug Tribe and addressing late birth registrations. For the national ID registration, the PSA personnel were able to register 71 individuals, including infants and children.

This activity is a part of the PSA's nationwide efforts to provide every Filipino, regardless of their location, with a National ID. The National ID is an essential tool for improving government services, ensuring better access to social programs, and providing a more efficient system of identification for Filipinos across the country.

PSA Davao del Sur conducted the Third Level Training on Data Processing for the 2023 National Information Communications and Technology Household Survey (NICTHS) from February 4 to 6, 2025, at PSA Davao del Sur Provincial Statistical Office, Davao City.



The training equipped the hired data processors with essential technical skills in data validation, completeness checks, and consistency checks for clean files using the Data Processing System (DPS) developed by the Information Technology and Dissemination Service (ITDS).

The Data Processing of the 2023 NICHTS was set from February 10 to 25, 2025. It was successfully completed and submitted the clean data files to the Regional Statistical Services Office for further data review.

The 2023 NICTHS will provide crucial data on ICT access and usage in Filipino households, supporting policy formulation and digital inclusion efforts.
