

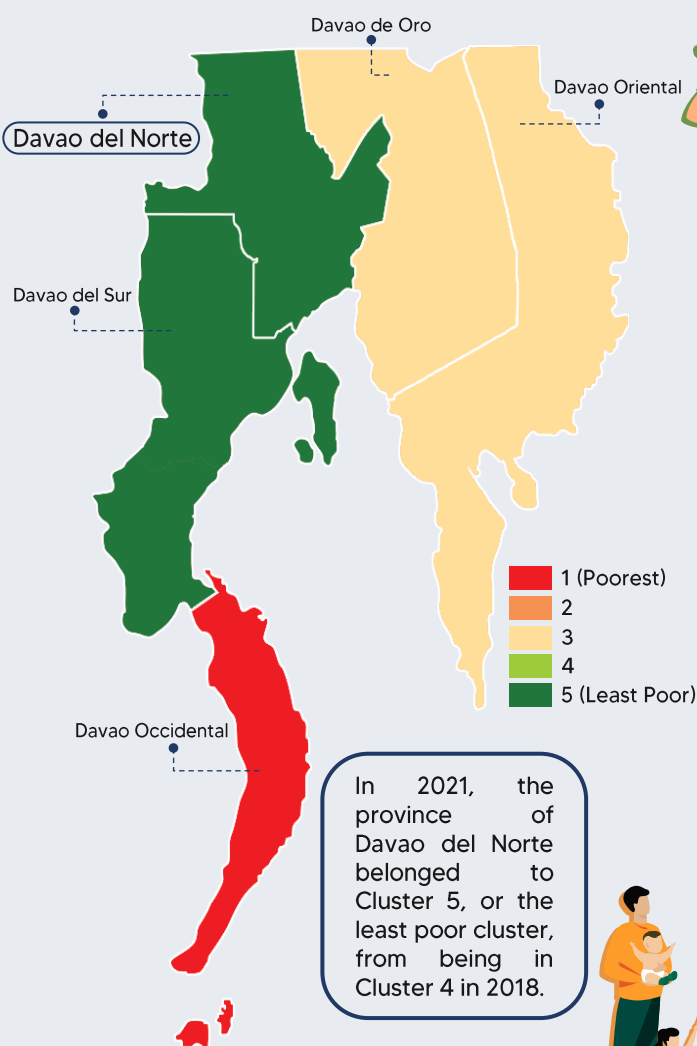
DAVAO DEL NORTE

2021 FULL YEAR POVERTY STATISTICS

Republic Act 8425 of 1997 (Social Reform & Poverty Alleviation Act)

defines poor as "Individuals and families whose income fall below the poverty threshold as defined by the NEDA and/or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing, and other essential amenities of life". (Section 3 of RA 8425)

Clustering of Provinces in Davao Region



In 2021, the province of Davao del Norte belonged to Cluster 5, or the least poor cluster, from being in Cluster 4 in 2018.



Among Population

Poverty Incidence

10.6%

of Davaoeños in Davao del Norte were poor in 2021, which translates to **112,970** persons in the province.

Poverty Threshold

In 2021, an individual needed at least

PHP 2,279

on the average, per month to meet his/her basic food and non-food needs.

Subsistence Incidence

2.9%

of persons in Davao del Norte were food poor in 2021, which translates to **30,958** Davaoeños in the province.

Food Threshold

In 2021, an individual needed at least

PHP 1,591

on the average, per month to meet his/her basic food needs.

Among Families

Poverty Incidence

7.3%

of Davaoeño families in Davao del Norte were poor in 2021, which translates to **18,653** families in the province.

Poverty Threshold

For a family of five to meet their basic food and non-food needs, they needed an average monthly income of at least

PHP 11,397.

Subsistence Incidence

2.0%

of families residing in the province were food poor in 2021, translating to **5,054** Davaoeño families in the province.

Food Threshold

For a family of five to meet their basic food needs, they needed an average monthly income of at least

PHP 7,956.
